What is dual enrollment?

Dual enrollment allows students to take college courses in lieu of high school courses. The courses provide dual credit -- fulfilling high school graduation requirements as well as credits toward a college degree. In Georgia, dual enrollment costs can be covered under the Move On When Ready (MOWR) scholarship for students who qualify.

What are the benefits?

- Start your college coursework and transition to university life while still having the support of family, friends & familiar surroundings.
- You decide how many college courses to take -- from one course to completing your entire freshman year of college while still in high school.
- Choose from a variety of college courses that will apply toward your college core, including honors classes. College courses transfer to other institutions if college is not your ultimate destination.
- State funding covers tuition and many fees, making DEHP a way for families to reduce the cost of a college education. Funding is non-needs-based.

Interested sophomores, juniors and their parents are strongly encouraged to attend an information session for more information about DEHP admissions, course options and funding.

How do I apply?

To be eligible for college's Dual Enrollment Honors Program, you must (on average- check with your college):

- Be a rising junior or senior
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA in college-prep academic core classes (not electives)
- Have a score of at least 1100 on the Critical Reading and Math portions of the SAT combined (24 on the ACT), with a minimum score of 530 in Critical Reading (23 ACT) and 530 in Math (22 ACT). The essay portion of the SAT/ACT is not considered.

Application deadline is usually in January for the upcoming fall semester.

Reserve your Testing date early!

You must take the SAT or ACT no later than December to ensure receipt of your scores by the admissions deadline. Make your reservations for the **earliest possible testing date** at www.collegeboard.org (SAT) or www.actstudent.org (ACT) in case you need to re-test. Use our school code – 110-068 – to make sure that scores are sent to the school office. You will also need to have the scores sent directly to the college(s) of your choice.

APPLY for MOWR (formerly ACCEL) Scholarship

After being accepted into a Dual Enrollment program, you will need to apply for the MOWR (Move On When Ready) scholarship and submit your list of courses to your high school guidance counselor.

Go to www.GAFutures.org and have your student create an account. Your student should be actively involved in this process and know passwords, etc.

Then, go to the MOWR-Move On When Ready portion of the website and complete the ONLINE application. Paper applications will not be accepted by the school office.

Complete the ONLINE MOWR application (paper applications will NOT be accepted). Choose **Veritas Classical Schools of North Atlanta** as your high school. You will need to type the entire name.

Once the online application is submitted, please email Diane Uplinger (diane@veritasschools.com) at the Veritas office and include the course list **on the COURSE form attached**. All information must be included.

The college financial aid office will then be able to process your scholarship dollars. NOTE – it is your responsibility to contact the Veritas office. The college will NOT contact us on your behalf.

MOWR Student Participation Agreement

As part of the new process, every student must complete this form and turn it in at the time of college registration. Please note that this form needs to be signed off on by a school official. Dave Kinsey, Bev Kinsey and Diane Uplinger have the authority to sign off on the form. Please be sure to complete the entire form (except for school signature portion) BEFORE you ask for the school to sign. Also, please note that due to having multiple campuses, you will need to make arrangements IN ADVANCE to have this document signed. Please do not wait until the last minute. We suggest that you make a copy of this signed form BEFORE sending it to your college.

College Transcripts and Grades
