Languages (Included in Humanities tuition)

Latin I: An introductory course using an inductive approach supplemented with additional grammar work.

Latin II: A continuation of Latin I, which emphasizes vocabulary and grammar knowledge while learning Latin inductively.

Greek I: This course will examine the basic parts of Greek grammar and its relationship to the English language. Students will begin reading New Testament Greek, building vocabulary, understanding New Testament word origins and definitions.

Greek II: A continuation of Greek I that will focus on reading and translating extensive portions of the New Testament, building Vocabulary, and understanding New Testament word origins and definitions.

Electives (\$60/month; classes will be offered if enough students register)

American Sign Language I: An introductory course into American Sign Language, Deaf culture, Deaf community, and Deaf history. Students will be evaluated on both receptive and expressive skills as well as assignments related to the culture and history of the Deaf.

American Sign Language II: A continuation of the foundations built in ASL I which will focus on the study of the rich language, culture, and history of the American Deaf community. Topics to be included are discussions on family and activities, ASL storytelling, classifiers, and more.

Graphic Design: This is a project-based course that is production intensive focusing on providing a historical account of the school year in the form of a yearbook. Students will use teamwork to develop a layout for the Veritas yearbook, create page spreads using photography and journalism skills, and learn to use the software provided to us by the yearbook production company.

Health: Developing a healthy body through proper nutrition, exercise and personal hygiene. Topics include preventing diseases, administering basic first aid, Biblical discernment regarding drug awareness and mental disorders.

Home Economics: This course, designed for both males and females, will cover many basic life skills including food, nutrition, cooking, etiquette, home finances, organization, and cleaning. Basic sewing and childcare are also covered.

Military History: Military History of the United States will cover military actions from the landing of the first Europeans to present. The course will examine the development of American military institutions (Army, Navy, USMC, Air Force, National Guard, and Reserves) in peace and war. This course covers organizational and technological developments, changing strategic doctrines, and the nationalization and professionalization, and the degree of coordination of the armed forces. We will also explore arms control, peace movements, and anti-war protests.

Spanish I: This class focuses mainly on oral communication and comprehension, equipping students to carry on conversations in Spanish. Class work reinforces the computer-based lessons, providing additional practice in speaking, reading, and writing in Spanish.

Spanish II: This class builds on Spanish I, which includes introducing new vocabulary, and focusing on conjugating Spanish verbs. Topics include: present tense verbs, reflexive verbs, gerunds, direct and indirect objects, present perfect tense, and past tense. Class work reinforces the computer-based lessons, providing further opportunities to practice Spanish reading, writing, and speaking skills.

World View Movie: The course will study the major worldviews in our culture, train students to discern them in movies and formulate responses. Students will study worldview articles and movie reviews from a variety of sources including Summit Ministries and Breakpoint. Students will present their own worldview articles in class.

Veritas Code of Conduct

1. Honor God, their parents, their instructors, and their fellow students according to biblical principles of conduct.

6. If you are absent due to **illness or being out of town**, please know that it is your responsibility to submit all missed work within two weeks. Work submitted after two weeks will not be accepted, and the student will receive a zero for the assignments. No make- up work will be accepted at the end of the semester.
7. Be honest and original in all assignments. **Plagiarism or cheating of any kind is not tolerated**, and students will receive a zero on the assignment.
8. Cell phones must be turned off during the school day and out of sight. ***This means students may not use phones at all while on campus. This includes before and after school, during breaks, or at lunch.*** If a call is necessary, the student will need to receive permission from his/her teacher. In addition to phones, iPods, tablets, smart watches, and electronic toys are also prohibited at Veritas.
9. Veritas will not permit any student to speak harshly against, slander, bully, cyber bully, or threaten any other student, teacher, administrator, or the institution itself via text, video, or social media. If Veritas becomes aware of such, we will notify parents and take disciplinary action. It is not our intent to police students' electronic social lives, but when other students or parents bring these types of comments to our attention, we will not hesitate to act. The Bible says that in the multitude of words sin is not lacking, but he who restrains his lips is wise (Proverbs 19:10).
