	attitude. [Continue <b>memorizing</b> this character trait and its meaning.]
	Bible verse to memorize by September 18th. Ephesians 6:1, "Children, obey your parents in
	the Lord, for this right."
	Over the next two weeks we will memorize verses 1-3 of Ephesians 6.
	Find these verses in your Bible. Read aloud to your parent or have your parent read it to you.
	<b>Hymn:</b> "Trust and Obey" Continue to sing this together as a family throughout the month.
	Something To Think About: In the days of Noah, people had completely forgotten about God
	and were not obeying Him. Can you think of ways the world today is like the time of Noah? In
	Noah's time, Noah was the only man who led his family in worship of God. God saved Noah
	and his family from a vast flood that destroyed every other person on earth, because Noah was
	faithful to obey God. What are some ways your family is obeying God and living differently
	from the people around you?
	Read & Discuss Genesis 6:5-22. Verse 22 says that Noah did everything just as God
	commanded. How easy or hard would it be to build a huge boat? What steps would you need to
	take? What tools would you use? How long would you have to work? Interesting fact: The ark
	was exactly six times longer than it was wide, the ration used by modern shipbuilders. Noah's
	obedience was a long-term commitment to a project. It took Noah 120 years to complete the
	task that God had given him to do. Noah continued to be obedient to God. God is faithful to
	those who obey Him.
	Activity: (Optional) Take some time to build an ark out of couch cushions, pillows and
	blankets. Fill the ark with stuffed animals, and pretend you are Noah's family. While you are in
	the ark, read the Bible story. You could eat animal crackers for a snack. ©
